

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO INCLUDE POLICY ADVOCACY IN YOUR PORTFOLIO?



- What? Supporting grantees' work to advance local, state or federal policy, and taking your own actions if desired
- Why? Achieving significant goals on a long-term basis requires public funds



- Is it legal? (Non-lobbying, lobbying, voter education, electioneering)
- Is it controversial?
- Can we measure success?
- Can we make a difference?



Because our resources alone are not enough to advance the causes we care about, we engage in advocacy efforts to promote public policies that advance our work.

HOW? A STARTING LIST OF OPTIONS...

- Fixed policy agenda with different sites, or fixed site with different agendas
- Join broad national movement or systems change initiative
- Use funder collaborative
- Allow grantees to include advocacy in their work or provide flexible funding
- Start with activities that are not advocacy, including capacity building
- Carry out your own actions

SOME CONSIDERATIONS...

- Choose issues carefully
- Give grantees flexibility
- Support community leaders in positions of power
- Give grantees support to understand state and federal laws
- Be prepared to work in coalition, including with "unexpected bedfellows"
- Support implementation and follow up
- Look for contribution, not attribution, in evaluations
- Invest for the long term
