


Trends informing how we approach

- 4 challenges: COVID, racial reckoning, climate, economy
- New vehicles



Process, process

- If you want to go fast, slow down
- Build/buy capacity in governance and facilitation
- Codify in writing





The Discomfort of First Order Questions

Why? What? and How?

Why do we avoid first order questions?

Why: Purpose, vision, values, culture

What: Focus areas and sought after impact

How: Approach to the work

Answers to first order questions must be articulated or refreshed

- 1. Governance
- 2. Org design, culture and staffing

Answers to second order questions support realization of first order priorities

- 1. Governance
- Scale up starts with governance
- Delineating roles, authorities, decision rights
- Human dynamics

Answers to second order questions support realization of first order priorities

- 2. Org design, culture, and staffing
- Setting parameters, including budget (cost of grants)
- Aligning on FTEs, outsourced partners
- Assessment model/framework

Grappling with Opportunities and Constraints

Aka, how do handle the "I don't want to be the XYZ Foundation" objection?!

Answers to second order questions support realization of first order priorities



The importance of identifying the key shifts and changes

- What are the key shifts we need to make?
- How will we phase and manage the change?
