Nearly 80% of family foundations created prior to 1970 focus on a specific geography with their giving vs 40% created since 2010.



Fewer than 10% of family foundations have decided to limit the life of their foundation, but more than 60% are considering this option.



2 out of 3 family foundations have founding donors still actively involved in the foundation.





